

**KEY GBV INTEGRATION COMPONENTS FOR NUTRITION PARTNERS**  
**UNICEF and WFP South Sudan**  
**September 2023**

Based on the recently developed programmatic package for integrating GBV risk mitigation in nutrition programming, UNICEF and WFP have prioritized the following elements of the package for inclusion in a targeted sub-set of 2024 Programme Documents (PD) with Nutrition implementing partners.

**1) Safety audits**

- Using the tools endorsed by the Nutrition cluster, conduct [safety audits](#) at all nutrition facilities covered under the PD.
- Use the findings from the safety audits to inform/adapt the nutrition programme as needed (structural improvements and/or changes to service delivery modality).
- *Suggested indicator: proportion of nutrition sites where at least one safety audit has been conducted and findings used to adapt programmatic delivery.*

**2) Strengthening GBV ↔ Nutrition referrals**

- Training on the local GBV referral pathway, how to safely refer and the [GBV Pocket Guide](#) – all Nutrition staff, CNVs and anyone else who has direct interaction with beneficiaries.
- Training on screening for malnutrition for GBV caseworkers and women and girls' friendly spaces (WGFS) staff in the targeted communities.
- Nutrition-focused awareness sessions in WGFS.<sup>1</sup>
- Regular meetings between Nutrition partner and UNICEF IP for GBV in the targeted locations to coordinate activities, adapt the GBV/Nutrition SOP template to the target location, and troubleshoot any issues around referrals
- *Suggested indicators: 1) proportion of staff and CNVs trained on how to safely refer and appropriately respond to GBV disclosures; 2) GBV/Nutrition SOP adapted to the target locations.*

**3) Consultations with women and girls on their satisfaction with/access to Nutrition services, conducted by female facilitators**

- Project justification and design should include any feedback from women and girls collected during assessments and/or previous monitoring activities
- M&E plan/implementation timeline to include frequency of consultations and how information will be used to inform programming
- *Suggested indicator: Number of consultations held with women and girls to gather information on their access to and satisfaction with Nutrition services.*

**4) Staffing**

- Project must provide the current proportion of male/female staff and CNVs. If the proportion is less than 50% female for either category, the PD must include a description of how the organization plans to reach at least 50% female staff and CNVs.

**OUTCOME INDICATOR:** Proportion of women and girls surveyed who report that the GBV risk mitigation measures have made them feel safer (to be measured at the end of the project).
